

Swimming Pool and Weight Room

Rules and Schedule

Please sign in at the check-in desk. The member signing in should note the number of people accompanying him/her. The pool is open from 5:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. M–Th and until 8 p.m. F–Su. The pool schedule is as follows: (opening and closing can be changed by committee at any time with proper notification)

M-F	5:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. - Adult only swim
M-F	11 a.m. to close - Open swim
M-Th	Pool closes at 9 p.m.
F-Su	Pool closes at 8 p.m.
Sa-Su	5:30 a.m. to 10 a.m. - Adult only swim
Su, M, W	10 a.m. to close - Open swim
F	Water Aerobics, 9–10 a.m.

Pool Rules

1. Diving is prohibited.
2. No personal pool toys allowed without prior management approval.
3. Running, wrestling, or shoving on the deck are dangerous and will not be permitted.
4. No street shoes are permitted on the deck around the pool.
5. The hot tub is for adults and children over the age of 5. The water temperature in the hot tub is maintained at 102 degrees Fahrenheit.
6. Please limit hot tub use to no more than 15 minutes and no more than eight persons at one time. Follow posted rules for its use.
7. No horseplay is allowed in the hot tub. It is designed for therapeutic reasons.
8. No food, beverages, or smoking is permitted in the courts, swimming area, men's steam bath and where otherwise posted.
9. Violations of any of these rules, members will be asked to leave the area.

Weight Room

No one under the age of 14 is allowed in the weight room area. This is for their safety as well as the safety of other people using the weights and cardio equipment. Machines are designed for use by fully developed bodies.

General Regulations

1. No paper, notice, placard, picture, or other written or printed material shall be posted or displayed anywhere on the premises without express permission of the General Manager or the Board of Directors. In this regard the General Manager shall be the agent of the Board of Directors.
2. Requests for, exceptions to, or changes in policy, and formal complaints concerning other members and employees of the club, shall be made in writing to the General Manager. IN NO CASE SHALL AN EMPLOYEE OF THE CLUB BE REPRIMANDED DIRECTLY BY ANY MEMBER unless explicitly directed to do so by the Board of Directors.
3. Leaving shoes and other wearing apparel in the entrance hall, dining room and grill is prohibited. This prohibition extends to towels and athletic equipment unless in the immediate possession of the owner. Members must park in designated areas within painted lines and must not park in designated non-parking areas and unloading zones.
4. Littering is prohibited everywhere on the Club premises.
5. Please use the receptacles provided for waste or carry the litter to the nearest disposal container. This includes cigarettes and cigars on the golf course.
6. Picnicking on the Club premises is not permitted except as a Club-sanctioned function. Food and alcoholic beverages are not to be brought to the Club, and catering of food services by outside agencies is prohibited on the Club premises.
7. Animals are not allowed on the premises with the exception of animals owned by the Club.
8. Bicycles, skateboards, roller blades, or scooters are not permitted around the clubhouse grounds. Bikes should be parked in the bicycle parking rack.
9. Children 14 and under must be accompanied by parents or otherwise supervised by an adult when on the Club premises. Members are responsible for the action of their children and guests at all times.

10. Children are not allowed to use the golf facilities on Ladies' Day (Wednesday), or Men's Day (Thursday), except during posted times permitting such usage (Nov. 1 through March 31).
11. The Club is not responsible for the loss of, or damage to, property owned by or under the control of members, visitors, or guests. (Club owned or leased property is excepted.)
12. Members and guests shall use the Club facilities at their own risk of injury or damage by other than employees of the Club.
13. The Board of Directors reserves the right to add to, change, or delete one or more of the rules and regulations without prior notice.
14. Upon proper showing, according to the provisions of the bylaws, a member or his dependents or guests is determined to have violated any of the rules, regulations, or conditions of membership, the member's right to use of the Club facilities may be suspended or terminated by the Board of Directors.
15. The General Manager is responsible for the enforcement of all rules and regulations.

Clubhouse Rules

1. General offices of the Club are open from 8 a.m. through 4 p.m. Monday through Friday except legal holidays. Clubhouse, including athletic and golf centers, will close for all major holidays. Notice will be posted prior to closures and closures will start at 3 p.m. on the day prior to the holiday.
2. Dining room and grill hours are subject to change from time to time. Notice of hours for service shall be posted. In general, the food and beverage department is closed on Monday. From November to Memorial Day, the hours will be W–Sa for full menu, light menu Sunday and Tuesday.
3. Loud, boisterous, or profane language will not be tolerated at any time.
4. The General Manager or his/her representative shall refuse service to any member who conducts himself in a manner detrimental to the Club or to individual members. Unbecoming conduct by a member or guest will subject the offender to disciplinary action, which may, after an appearance before the board, and upon findings of fact, result in suspension or even expulsion.
5. No event requiring use of Club facilities can be scheduled without prior clearance with the General Manager, or department heads.
6. Advance reservations are requested for dinner in the Cascade room and all Club social functions.
7. Bend Golf Club is a private club with a liquor license. Members must accompany their guests. The Club allows minors in the grill away from the immediate vicinity of the bar. They are not allowed to loiter after service and must leave following their meal.
8. Persons under the age of 16 are not permitted in the golf locker rooms unless accompanied by an adult.
9. Smoking is not permitted anywhere inside the buildings at Bend Golf Club. No food, beverages, or smoking are permitted in the courts, swimming area, men's steam room and where otherwise posted. No outside beverages may be brought on premises including the golf course at any time.
10. Limit use of hot tub to 15 minutes or less. Follow posted rules for their use.

11. Members are required to comply with the provisions of the Club liquor license as interpreted and implemented by the General Manager, department heads, and wait staff, in accordance with state laws.

Medical Leaves of Absence

In the event of prolonged or severe illness, members in good standing holding a regular golf membership or young professional golf membership may apply for a leave of absence subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein. This Policy is in place to protect the equity of shareholders and, as such, no other class of membership shall be granted inactive status.

Application for inactive membership status shall be made on a form approved by and submitted to the board of directors for review at the next scheduled meeting. The request for inactive status shall be accompanied by a letter from the member's physician outlining the medical justification for the request. All requests will be in accordance with the bylaws posted on the website under "Reference documents," reviewed, and approved or denied by the board of directors.

Unpaid Indebtedness

All dues and charges are due 30 days from billing date. When the dues and other charges of any member shall remain unpaid for a period of one month, a written notice shall be sent. If such indebtedness is delinquent for a period of 61+ days or more, the membership status will be on a cash basis only, no charging privileges.

If the indebtedness is delinquent for a period of 91+ days or more, the membership will be forfeited until payment is made and the Member shall no longer be a member of the club. No prior or suspended member who owes the club any monies will be allowed on club property at all. This includes being a guest of a current member or to play in golf or tennis tournaments.

ACH Payments

The club encourages all members to take advantage of automatic payments of your monthly bill using the club's ACH program. All you have to do is give the office a copy of a voided check and they will set your account up to have the bill taken out of your bank account each month. It can be set up for either the 5th or 10th of the month. This is good for both you and the club. You don't have to worry about sending a check and the club gets the monies electronically deposited into its account.

Dress Code

Athletic/Tennis Facility

Appropriate workout attire is expected. Ragged or torn clothing is not acceptable. Non-marking (white or clear) tennis shoes are required for all athletic activities.

Pool Area/Snack Bar

A cover-up or shirt is required over your swimsuit and footwear must be worn when walking outside of the pool area.

Clubhouse

Golf wear as prescribed above or tailored warm-ups or branded athletic wear are permitted in the clubhouse areas.

Unacceptable examples:

- Ragged T-Shirts
- Clothing with heavy perspiration

Sweatshirts (neat and clean) are permitted, provided they are not sporting logos or slogans which are profane, suggestive or in poor taste.

Head wear is permitted in the Cascade dining room only during golf functions. Clean and neat denim pants (no baggy pants) are permitted.

Golf Course and Practice Facilities

Men: Shirts must have collars and sleeves and be tucked in at all times unless banded. Mocks are acceptable. Tailored golf shorts are acceptable with mid-thigh length or longer; no tennis length or short shorts. Neat denim and sweatshirts/ sweaters in good taste are acceptable. T-shirts and athletic wear are not acceptable.

Women: Sleeveless shirts must have a collar: halter/tank tops are not permitted. Tailored golf shorts/skirts are acceptable with mid-thigh length or longer; no tennis length or short shorts. Neat denim and sweatshirts/sweaters that are in good taste are acceptable. T-shirts and athletic wear are not acceptable.

The same rules apply to all children/juniors. Exceptions can be made for infants and small children as deemed appropriate by the Club staff. Any changes to the dress code will be published in the Tradition newsletter, posted on the website, and around the clubhouse, as notification to the membership.

Purpose

The dress code is designed to offer our members comfort while maintaining a standard of decorum for all members, guests and visitors. We recognize that we are much more than a golf course. Our members come to dine, socialize, golf, play tennis, and work out. Our dress code is designed to facilitate the needs of all members. The dress code applies to everyone including guests and youngsters/juniors.

Members are responsible for acquainting their guests, including children, with these dress rules. Appropriate attire is available in the Golf Shop.

The General Manager, the Food and Beverage Manager or their designees, the golf professional and golf marshals are responsible for, and have the authority to enforce, all rules and regulations pertaining to the dress code.

Guests

1. In general, guest privileges are established by the bylaws and by policy of the board of directors where not in conflict with the bylaws.
2. Persons residing within 50 miles of Bend, or with a Bend mailing address, may be invited as guests of regular members subject to the prevailing guest fees to use the golf course or tennis courts once each calendar month, as we hope they will join the club. There are no restrictions on the number and frequency of visits by out-of-town guests but please check in with the pro shop or the athletic desk if you have out-of-town guests.
3. Members are to accompany their guests.
4. Guests of members may be invited to use the athletic center subject to the prevailing use fee and frequency limitations.
5. Golf, athletic, tennis and social members may invite guests without limit in frequency or numbers for social purposes, (dining room and grill). Unless special restrictions are imposed, guest privileges extend to all social functions of the Club. However, for large parties, advance arrangement with the management is necessary.
6. Members are responsible for the actions of their guests while on Club premises.
7. Official Club functions have priority over guest privileges in the use of any Club facility.
8. Subject to approval by the Board of Directors, the management may restrict the use of Club facilities by individual members in favor of private parties, banquets, and organized social functions.
9. Vacationing members of any recognized private club are extended the privileges of the Club (subject to availability of starting times on the golf course) at the regularly established fees. Regular members and their guests have priority over visitors.
10. Guest fees and fees for visiting members of other clubs are established by the Board of Directors and are subject to change without notice. Court fees include swimming privileges.

State Board of Health Regulations

1. All persons are required to take a cleansing shower before entering the pool or hot tub.
2. Use of the pool or hot tub is prohibited for persons with a communicable disease, or with any kind of bandage applied to their person.
3. Spitting in the pool or the hot tub is prohibited.
4. No food, non-alcoholic beverages (unless in a plastic container), alcoholic beverages, candy, or gum may be brought into the pool enclosure.
5. No person should swim alone or without knowledge of the management.
6. A responsible adult shall accompany all non-swimmers and children under the age of 14 and be present on the deck at all times.
7. All children not "potty trained" must wear rubber pants over a diaper. If any fecal matter gets into the pool, it will be shut down for 8 hours.
8. Each person and guests MUST sign in before entering the pool area.
